About Abenteuerzentrum

Abenteuerzentrum im Grunewald is a non-profit youth organization which is creating space for educational activities of different kind, with the special focus on outdoor education and adventure-based learning. Our main activity is the youth center we run in the Berlin district Grunewald. Besides accommodation for youth groups and seminars our organisation offers variety of adventure opportunities: we run our own high rope course, we organize integration activities for young people as well as seminars and trainings for youth workers and youth leaders. Using our "Mongolian" village" we carry on cycle of projects on the topics of migration and inclusion. We also organize holiday camps, adventure tours and integrational youth exchanges outside of berlin for kids and teenagers from all over Germany and Europe. Significant part of our activities are also focused on scouting methodology.







PROFILE OF VOLUNTEERS:

All EVS candidates should be in the age of 18 to 30 years old.

Priority will be given to young people with limited access to international mobility projects.

We can offer EVS placements for 6 volunteers from Italy, Romania and Poland (two from each country). In order to assure gender balance in the project each country should search for one boy and one girl.

Basic knowledge of language is required for minimum communication. Basic knowledge of German will be helpful in daily work.

Financial Conditions

MOBILITIES OF VOLUNTEERS (per person, duration 12 months)

covered from the programme: accomodation, food, public transport, language course

transport from a city of residence to Berlin and back up to 275 EUR

pocket money: 121 EUR/month each sending organisation will receive 5% of the grant forseened for each voluntter

INTERNATIONAL SEMINARS (per person, duration 3 days)

covered from the programme: accomodation, food, programme

transport to Berlin and back up to 170 EUR

CONDITIONS FOR REIMBURSEMENT:

Travel costs will be fully reimbursed up to the limit, what should be enough to get to Germany – therefore we expect that everybody will get back 100% of the travel. If you spend less for your travel you will get exactly the amount you spent. If you spend more, you will get the amount from the table. Reimbursement of travel costs will only be done upon full attendance of the seminar. It will be transferred to the your bank account after receiving all the orginal tickets and boarding passes.

Reimbursement will be done in EURO.



CONFERENCE (per organisation, duration 1 day)

80% of direct costs: up to 560 EUR (80% of 700 EUR)

80% of indirect costs: 39 EUR (80% of 49 EUR)

CONDITIONS FOR REIMBURSEMENT:

Here the reimbursement is little bit more complicated. This category of the budget is based on real costs and therefore we need originals of all bills and invoices. You can use this money to cover rental of rooms and equipment and catering, but after the event we will need to receive all invoices. When it comes to the indirect costs it is enough when your organisation produces us an invoice for 49 EUR for "indirect costs"

Erasmus+ covers only 80% of all costs. They way to deal with it is that you should spend up to 560 EUR for the event and produce us an invoice for your personal costs for the remaining 140 EUR (20%). In this way we can report the full amount of the grant and you can receive all money you spent for the event.

HOW TO GET THERE?

From HAUPTBAHNHOF - Main Railway Station:

You need to take train S5 (direction Spandau) or S7 (direction Potsdam) to Zoologische Garten and then X10 (direction Teltow Stadt). By this bus get to the bus stop Teplitzer Strasse. You are almost there, just follow the map below (10 minutes walking).



From ZOB (ZENTRALER OMNIBUSBAHNHOF) - Central Bus Station:

You need to take train S41 to the station Halensee. There you need to walk out of the station (there is only one exit) and cross the street in order to get the X10 (direction Teltow Stadt) or M29 (direction Roseneck). By this bus get to the bus stop Teplitzer Strasse. You are almost there, just follow the map (10 minutes walking).



From TEGEL airport:

In front of the airport you need to take the X9 (direction Zoologischer Garten). On the bus stop called Jungfernheide you need to get off and change for S-Bahn. There take the train number S42 (direction Ring) and get to the station Halensee. There you need to walk out of the station (there is only one exit and cross the street in order to take the X10 (direction Teltow Stadt) or M29 (direction Roseneck). By this bus get to the bus stop Teplitzer Strasse. You are almost there, just follow the map (up to 10 minutes walking).





From SCHOENEFELD airport:

Find the S-bahn station Flughafen Berlin-Schönefeld Bhf. There take the train S45 (direction S Südkreuz) and go to the last station Südkreuz. In Südkreuz change to the train number S42 (direction Ring) and get to the station Halensee. There you need to walk out of the station (there is only one exit) and cross the street in order to get the X10 (direction Teltow Stadt) or M29 (Direction Roseneck). By this bus get to the bus stop Teplitzer Strasse. You are almost there, just follow the map (10 minutes walking).
